
so we are asking members to

OFFICER ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

ARTICLE II

DUTIES OF CLUB OFFICERS – The duties of the elected club officers are, but are not limited to, the following:

PRESIDENT:

- 1. Acts as chairman at all meetings including those of the Executive Committee.
- 2. Plans, organizes and directs the execution of club programs and policy in accordance with the expressed will of the membership.
- 3. Appoints all committees and instructs them as to the desired results.
- 4. Authorizes the incurrence of financial obligations consistent with the mandates of the members.
- 5. Orders and approves payment of club funds for authorized obligations.
- 6. Has management responsibility for the performance of all elected club officers, activity chairmen, and standing or special committees.

FIRST VICE PRESIDENT:

- 1. Assumes the duties of the President in his absence.
- 2. Serves on the Executive Committee.
- 3. Responsible for all additional duties delegated to him by the President.
- 4. Acts as Membership Chairman, and maintains an accurate up to date club roster of Associate, Full Active, Honorary and Lifetime members.
- 5. Responsible for printing of mailing labels (from the roster) and delivering them to the Corresponding Secretary in a timely manner to insure that the "Green Buzzard" can be mailed on time.

SECOND VICE PRESIDENT:

- 1. Assumes the duties of the President in the absence of the President and the First Vice President.
- 2. Serves on the Executive Committee.
- 3. Responsible for additional duties delegated to him by the President.
- 4. Chairman of the clubs Disciplinary and Activities committee.
- 5. Responsible for organizing and coordinating all the clubs ski racing with championship series and snowbird races.

RECORDING SECRETARY:

- 1. Takes the minutes at club and Executive Committee meetings, transcribes these minutes for presentation at the next club meeting, maintains and archives copies of all minutes during the club year, and delivers complete copies of these minutes to the Historian at the end of each club year.
- 2. Maintains listing of all standing and special committees.
- 3. Notifies officers, activity chairmen, and members of duties assigned by the President.

4. Serves on the Executive Committee.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY:

- 1. Maintains a file of all club correspondence and records.
- 2. Prepares and mails meeting notices and other communications to the membership.
- 3. Is responsible for the creation, duplication and mailing of the club's news letter "Green Buzzard" twice a month September through April, and once a month May through August.
- 4. Serves on the Executive Committee.

TREASURER:

- 1. Responsible for the collection, deposit and accounting of all funds received by the club from all activities of the club.
- 2. Maintains the club check book, and reconciles the account monthly with the bank statements.
- 3. Pays out club funds at the request of the President for the liquidation of all authorized bills and any other financial obligations.
- 4. Prepares and presents current financial reports at club meetings and at the end of the club year.
- 5. Responsible to the auditing committee for the accuracy and completeness of all the club's financial records and the balance of all financial transactions and records. These records are to be maintained utilizing the generally accepted accounting principles known as "double entry book keeping."
- 6. Serves on the Executive Committee.

HISTORIAN:

- 1. Responsible for maintaining a history of the ski club.
- 2. Arranges for pictures to be taken at club functions and maintains these photos in club albums.
- 3. Manages and supervises the gathering and storage of club and ski memorabilia for future generations of the club.
- 4. Keeps current copies of Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws and records all changes.
- 5. Serves on the Executive Committee.
